Here are some things on a plane.

A **tray** is a flat thing that carries food or drink. It folds out from the seat in front.

A **locker** is a small cupboard where you can put things. It can be above you.

The **emergency exit** is where you go in a dangerous situation.

Your **seat** is where you sit on the plane.

The **aisle** is a way between a line of seats.

Your **hand luggage** or carry-on luggage is what you take onto the plane with you.

Here are ways a plane moves:



take off - the plane leaves the ground



land - the plane comes onto the ground from the air

airport - a place with buildings where passengers get on and off planes and wait

terminal - the place in the airport where passengers arrive and depart from

gate - a door in an airport that passengers go through to get on or off their plane

arrivals - the place in the airport where passengers come to from the plane

departures - the place where passengers wait before they get onto (board) a plane

runway - the place where planes take off and land

Add them and their meanings to your vocabulary notebook.






